DAY THREE: CARE FOR OTHERS AT HOME

CARE OBJECTIVE: To learn the importance of caring for others at home.

CARE CONCEPTS:

Care Helpfulness Kindness

INTRODUCTION:

Now we know how Scarlett takes care of herself at home. Let's see how Scarlett and her family take care of others at home. Let's hear what happens to poor Pugs in this story.

AFTER STORY ACTIVITIES: [HAVE STUDENTS VIEW AND REFER TO THE STORY AS NEEDED]

QUESTIONS:

- 1. Who do you think takes care of Scarlett at home? Scarlett takes care of herself in some ways and her parents and grandmother take care of her also
- 2. How did the family take care of others at home? What did Scarlett's dad do? Took out the trash, tucked Scarlett in bed and taught her a lesson about forgiveness What did Scarlett's mom do? Dressed Josh, packed baby's supplies, left work early to take care of Scarlett and Josh What did Scarlett do? Fed the dog and herself, put dish in sink, carried diaper bag, cleaned up Pugs' mess
- 3. Scarlett fed Pugs, but what did she forget to do? To let him out What happened because Scarlett didn't care for him completely? He went to the bathroom on the floor, Scarlett slipped down in the mess

- 4. Can you think of some other ways that Scarlett could help at home? Accept answers (Examples: Help Mom with Josh's care, set the table, make her bed, clean her room, play with the dog, etc.)
- 5. At the end of the story, what did Scarlett's dad tell her the "F" stood for in the word "Family"? Forgiveness
- 6. In the story, when her dad asked her if she knew why it was important to take care of Pugs, Scarlett said, "Because Pugs can't reach the door handle." What did Scarlett mean by that? That he couldn't let himself outside to go to the bathroom

So remember, students, it's important to be helpful and take care of others at home.



CARE MAIN IDEA: There are many ways that we can help others at home. Remember to do your part, <u>be helpful</u>, and care for others at home.
